### Communication and Language

- Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them.
- Listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound.

### Personal, Social and Emotional

- Revise and revise the fundamental movement skills they have already acquired: rolling, crawling, walking, jumping, running, hopping, skipping and climbing.
- Negotiates space successfully when playing racing and chasing games with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction to avoid obstacles.





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#### Maths

- Count objects, actions or sounds.
- Subitise.
- Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value.
- Understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers.

## Specific Areas

### Understanding the World

- Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside.
- Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them.

### Literacy

- Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences.
- Begins to beak the flow of speech into words, to hear and say the initial sound in words and may start to segment the sounds in words and blend them together.

#### Music


Christmas singing.
