



Guidelines for any child who has an infectious disease and must remain off school

| Chicken Pox | At least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until the blisters have all crusted over | |
|---|---|--|
| Diarrhoea and Vomiting | 48 hours after their last episode | |
| Cold and Flu-like symptoms including Covid 19 | They no longer have a temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance for COVID 19 which is currently 3 days | |
| Impetigo | Their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they have started on antibiotics | |
| Measles | 4 days after the rash first appeared | |
| Mumps | 5 days after the swelling started | |
| Scabies | They've had their first treatment | |
| Scarlet Fever | 24 hours after they start taking antibiotics | |
| Whooping Cough | 48 hours after they start taking antibiotics | |
