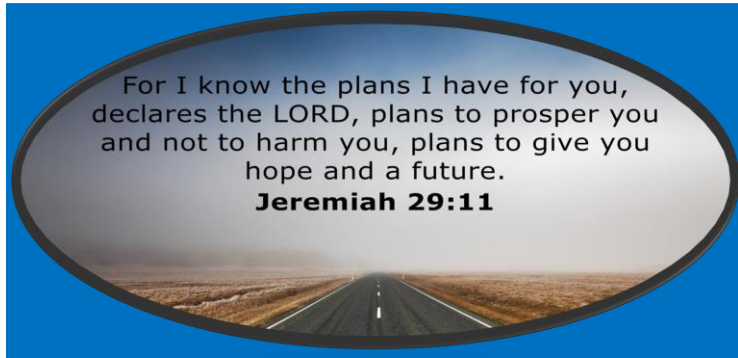

Safeguarding

Tips for children to stay safe on social media - Location settings

- **Review the location settings** - Remind them, and explain why, they shouldn't share location on posts, public forums and chats, videos, or with people they don't know. Review the location settings on their favourite app or game and talk to them about what they're sharing online.

Sometimes it might be appropriate for your child to share their location with a trusted adult or friend. For example, if they're traveling home alone or arranging to meet a group of friends outside school, then it can be a good way to help keep them safe

Remember: If children share their location publicly, it could be seen by someone they don't know.

This can increase the risk of cyberbullying, stalking or unwanted contact (from friends or others), or becoming a target.
