Safeguarding

Simple steps to combat cold weather in the UK

- 1. **Keep an eye on the weather forecast.** Visit the Met Office website for up-to-date weather forecasts.
- 2. If bad weather is forecast, make sure you have everything you need. Check you've got enough medication and food in case it's harder to leave the house. A bottle of water could be handy if the water supply is interrupted.
- 3. Have torches handy around the home in case of a power cut. It's a good idea to keep some spare batteries somewhere convenient, too.
- 4. **Keep emergency numbers nearby.** Call **105** in the event of a power cut you can report a power cut and get information and advice if there's one in your area. You can also register with your supplier's Priority Services Register so they'll call you in the event of a power cut.
- 5. **Take extra care if the ground is slippery.** Wear shoes with good grip and consider keeping salt and sand mixture handy to grit paths. You could ask your neighbours for help to clear paths or driveways in bad weather.
- 6. **Plan ahead when driving.** Try to avoid going out in the car in bad weather if possible, and make sure you follow advice on driving conditions near you. If you do need to go out, pack up the following kit in case you get stuck: blankets, a bottle of water or flask of hot drink, some snacks, a shovel, a deicer or scraper, a mobile phone and charger.
